What the shadows hide


Verse 3

C MAJOR SCALE

What is a scale? A scale is a set of notes ordered by their pitch. The pitch describes how high, or how low the note. Remember, in music we have seven different note names A, B, C, D, E, F, G. Scales are the building blocks for songs!

The C major scale will begin on the note C and go all the way up to the next C. The starting and ending notes are the same!




Using the scale above, can you fill in the missing note names?



C MAJOR SCALE

In order to help us learn to sing the scale, we sometimes will sing using special words, called solfege syllables. Try singing the scale below!

Since solfege is used to help us sing the notes, let's practice and sing your answer!


ACCIDENTALS

What is an accidental? If a composer wanted to alter a note from the scale, she could add either a sharp # or a flat \flat in front of the note. The sharp # raises the note by a half step and the \flat lowers the note by a half step.


Here is an example of a flat ♭



Remember, here is a scale without any accidentals.



One other accidental we see is the natural \$\dagger\$, which puts the note in the middle. Can you see the different below.

Can you find the highest note and lowest notes you have to sing?


First, circle the highest note you can find. Then, circle the lowest note.
